


A. Greek phrases and words found in TLIG Messages

1. On July 30, 1987 Jesus speaks to Vassula in Greek (footnote 3). Jesus says “**ela thipla mou, ime o Christos**” which is “come near Me, I am Christ”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 1.
2. On August 5, 1987 Jesus speaks to Vassula in Greek (footnote 1). Jesus says “**Egho ime**” that is “I am”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 2.
3. At the end of many messages Jesus signs as I X Θ Υ Ξ  (**Ichthys**) which it was the sign of the first Christians (message May 20, 1987). “Ichthys” is the Greek word for "fish". The Greek initials stand for "Jesus Christ, God's Son, the Saviour". To listen the Greek pronunciation of the word I X Θ Υ Ξ (Ichthys) open the sound file No 3.
4. On December 2, 1987 Jesus speaks to Vassula in Greek (footnote 1). Jesus says “**ie emphasises itan**” which is “the apparitions were (were there)”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 4.
5. On September 7, 1987 (footnote 1), on May 12, 1995 (footnote 4) and on Oct 8, 1992 (footnote 1) our Lady speaks to Vassula in Greek. Our Lady says “**pethi mou**” which is “My child”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 5.
6. On July 24, 1987 (footnote 1) Jesus says in Greek “**Agapa Me**” which is “Love Me”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 6.
7. On February 10, 1987 (footnote 1) as well as in other messages Jesus says in Greek “**Hades**” which is “Purgatory”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 7.
8. On May 17, 1987 (footnote 2) our Lady says to Vassula in Greek “**agapi mou**” which means “My beloved”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 8.
9. On July 7, 1987 (footnote 2) Jesus says to Vassula in Greek “**pono**” which means “I ache”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 9.
10. On January 29, 1988 (footnote 2) Vassula writes in Greek “**poss**” which means “How”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 10.
11. On April 26, 1988 Vassula writes in Greek “**O babas mou ipé na ...**” which means “Abba told me to ...”. To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 11.

12. On April 26, 1988 (footnote 1) Jesus says to Vassula in Greek "**baba**" which means "Abba". To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 12.
13. On May 1, 1992 (footnote 1) as well as in other messages it is written Vassula's second name (not surname, but second first name) which is "**Paraskevi**" and in Greek means "Friday". To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 13.
14. On Dec 2, 1992 (footnote 1) as well as in other messages Jesus signs as "**ic**" which is short for "Jesus". To listen the Greek pronunciation of Jesus open the sound file No 14.
15. On Jan 6, 1993 (footnote 3) Vassula writes in Greek "**Vassilia mou, yiati kles?**" which mean "My King, why do You weep?" To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 15.
16. On April 23, 1993 (footnote 1) our Lady greeted to Vassula in Greek "**Christos anessti**" which means "Christ has risen" and Vassula replied "**Alithos anessti**" which means "He has truly risen". To listen the Greek pronunciation of both open the sound file No 16.
17. On December 6, 1993 (footnote 1) as well as in other messages our Lady says to Vassula in Greek "**i Panayia**" which means "Our Lady, Most Holy". To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 17.
18. On October 24, 1994 (footnote 2) the Father says to Vassula in Greek "**Pantocrator**" which is Greek Orthodox terminology and the most common translation is "Almighty" or "All-powerful". To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 18.
19. On October 19, 1998 (footnote 10) Jesus says to Vassula in Greek "**Paraskevi 'μου'**" which in Greek μου = my and all together means "My Paraskevi". To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 19.
20. On February 3, 1993 (footnote 2) Jesus calls Vassula with her official birth name which is "**Vassiliki**". To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 20.
21. On April 28, 2000 (footnote 1) Vassula writes in Greek "**I AKRA TAPINOSI**" which means "the ultimate humility" To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 21.
22. On May 21, 2001 (footnote 1) Vassula writes in Greek "**pathos**" which means "passion" To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 22.
23. On January 6, 2003 in footnote 4 the Greek word "**Pathi**" is used and it means "passions" To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 23.

24. On May 21, 2001 (footnote 1) the Lord writes in Greek “**kenosis**” which means “space” To listen the Greek pronunciation open the sound file No 24.

B. Long Greek phrases found in TLIG messages

1. On February 2, 1988 (footnote 11) our Lady speaks to Vassula in Greek. Read directly the translation, however, mention the original text is in Greek.
